2.3 NIRB Part 4 Screening – Tundra Copper Corporation's "Coppermine Exploration" Project

Tundra Copper Corporation's "Coppermine Exploration" project is undergoing a preliminary screening conducted by the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB). NIRB is currently seeking input on the proposed project by May 4, 2015. Tundra

Copper Corp's application failed to identify that the project activities are planned in an area which overlaps with the Bluenose-East (BNE) Caribou herd range. Further, the application makes no mention of potential spatial and temporal impacts to the BNE calving ground. The proposed project is located on the calving ground of the BNE caribou and exploration will be conducted during calving and post-calving. As well, the proposed project is timed during the photo survey planned for June 2015, led by the Government of the Northwest Territories (GNWT), which could potentially result in aerial conflicts.

The Tłįchǫ Government (TG), the GNWT and the Government of Nunavut (GN) plan to provide submissions to NIRB. TG has requested that the WRRB review Tundra Copper Corporation's application and consider providing comments to NIRB.

The WRRB will prepare a written submission to NIRB, by the May 4th deadline date, focusing on the following items:

- Identifying the BNE calving grounds as an area for no exploration or development at any time. Calving grounds are significantly important for caribou ecology both spatially and temporally;
- Informing NIRB about the 2013 population estimate of the BNE and the current conversation concerns;
- Informing NIRB about as the following federally listed species: peregrine falcon anatum/tundrius complex (special concern), short-eared owl (special concern), and barren-ground caribou, Dolphin and Union population (special concern); and the following COSEWIC assessed species: grizzly bear (special concern) and wolverine (special concern); and,
- Notifying both Tundra Copper Corporation and NIRB of the potential safety concerns with regards to the proposed project conflicting with the proposed June 2015 photo survey.

The WRRB will share its submission with TG, GNWT, GN and member boards of the ACCWM.

2.4 COSEWIC National Designation – Yellow-banded Bumble Bee

On March 5, 2015, the Board received a request for review comments on the 2-month interim status report for the Yellow-banded Bumble Bee along with a recommendation for a national designation and reason(s) for the Board's recommendation.

The 2-month interim status report suggests the designation be "special concern".

Nearly 50-60% of the global range of the Yellow-banded Bumble Bee occurs in Canada. This bumble bee has declined to a level of abundance at which its persistence is increasingly threatened by genetic, demographic or environmental change, but decline is not sufficient to qualify the species as threatened, due to relative abundance in the northern and western parts of its range. An approximate 34% decline in abundance in Southern Canada is suspected due to pathogen spill over from managed bumble bee colonies in commercial greenhouses and habitat conversion.

increasingly threatened.
