Discussions on procedural matters

The Tłįchǫ Government and Department of Environment and Natural Resources (ENR), Government of the Northwest Territories would like to thank you for the meeting via conference call this morning. We appreciate the willingness of staff of the Wek'èezhìi Renewable Resources Board (WRRB) to have discussions with us on procedural matters as they relate to the wolf management proposal and look forward to continuing dialogue. Further to these discussions, we would also like to bring to your attention the engagement our two governments have undertaken over the past two months on wolf monitoring and management actions.

The Chiefs Executive Council of the Tłįchǫ Government was briefed on wolf management actions by its staff and gave their approval on January 16, 2020. Community meetings were held in February 2020 as part of the Tłįchǫ Government, Department of Culture and Lands Protection community tour in Wekweètì (February 3), Gamèti (February 5) and Whatì (February 25). Between 10 and 20 community members were present at each of these meetings. Wolf management actions including harvest support and aerial removals were discussed and no major concerns identified.

In addition, a harvester meeting was held in Wekweètì, December 17th, 2019 and subsequent training workshop on January 9- 13, 2020, brought in 18 Tłįchǫ participants from surrounding Tłįchǫ communities. At the workshop the possibility of aerial removal of wolves was discussed as a supplement to harvesting if the community based program was not successful at reaching targets. Some concern was raised that aerial removal would take away harvesting opportunities from trappers and possible income.

ENR engaged with a number of Indigenous governments and organizations focusing on both the Joint Proposal on Management Actions for the Bathurst Ekwò (Barren-ground caribou) Herd: 2019 – 2021 and the Joint Proposal on Management Actions for the Bluenose-East 7ekwo (Barren-ground caribou) Herd: 2019 – 2021. A detailed engagement log is provided in the attachment.

Further, it is noted that discussions and support for wolf management actions was heard at WRRB's public hearing on the Bluenose-East herd held in Behchokò, April 9-11, 2019.

The Government of the Northwest Territories is currently consulting on the Joint Proposal on Management Actions for Wolves (dìga) on the Bathurst and Bluenose-East Barrenground Caribou (?ekwo) Herd Winter Ranges: 2020 – 2025. The consultation period closes today and we cannot yet comment on the outcome.
