Work Plan for Sahtì Ekwò (Bluenose-East Barren-ground caribou)

Joint Management Proposal

Dated: August 19, 2024

Purpose of the Work Plan

To outline the processes and timelines to be followed for the Sahtì Ekwò joint management proposal.

Background

The 2023 population estimate for the Sahtì Ekwò herd is showing a stabilization and an increasing trend. The short-term goal of the proposed management actions is to promote conditions that will allow for continued growth of the herd. Over the longer-term, the goal is to enable sustainable caribou harvesting that meets the needs of all Indigenous communities across the herd's range. Within Wek'èezhì, the goal is to accommodate Tłı̨ch̨o rights to harvest caribou throughout M̨owhì Gogha Dè N̨ı̨łt̨èè.

On August 1, 2024, Environment & Climate Change (ECC), Government of the Northwest Territories (GNWT) and Tłı̨ch̨o Government (TG) submitted a joint management proposal, entitled "Joint Proposal on Management Actions for the Bluenose-East Barren-ground caribou (Sahtì ekwò) Herd 2024-2026" ("the Proposal") to the WRRB, outlining proposed management actions for Sahtì Ekwò in Wek'èezhì. Following an initial assessment of the Proposal, the WRRB has determined that a **modified Level 1 review** is appropriate, as per its Rule for Management Proposals. Therefore, on August 19, 2024, the Board established the 2024 Sahtì Ekwò Management Proceeding and an online public registry.

Scope of the Proceeding

Based on the WRRB's Rule for Management Proposals, the Board deems a modified Level 1 Proceeding to be sufficient to serve the public interest. The primary objective of this Proceeding is to recommend management actions for Sahtì Ekwò management in Wek'èezhì for 2024 to 2026.

Guiding Principles

The following principles will guide the Work Plan throughout this Proceeding:

- The Board will act in the public interest (Sections 12.1.2, Tłı̨ch̨o Agreement), including subsistence, resident, non-resident and commercial harvesters;
- The management proposal process shall have regard for the principles and practices of conservation and the importance of wildlife and its habitat to the Tłı̨ch̨o First Nation well-being, way of life and land-based economy (Sections 12.1.5.a and 12.1.1, Tłı̨ch̨o Agreement);
- The management proposal process shall take steps to acquire and use traditional knowledge as well as other types of scientific information and expert opinion (Section 12.1.6, Tłı̨ch̨o Agreement);
- The management proposal process shall be carried out in a timely manner;
- The Board will review the Proposal and consider potential management actions based on evidence and rationale submitted by GNWT, TG or any other Party; and,

- The Board will review the Proposal and consider potential management actions in order to meet the Board’s mandate (mission) and applicable policies.

Work Plan Objectives

The Work Plan is to achieve the following objectives:

- Compile a broad range of focused input through the Proceeding;
- Ensure adequate information is gathered to complete the management proposal process;
- Facilitate a thorough, inclusive and timely management proposal process; and,
- Determine and/or recommend management actions to promote conditions that will allow for continued growth of the Sahtì Ekwò herd and enable sustainable caribou harvesting that meets the needs of all Indigenous communities across the herd’s range.

Opportunities for Community Engagement

- The Board required GNWT and TG to inform and engage with communities and Indigenous organizations regarding the Proposal submission;
- The Board will include a notification(s) regarding the management proposal process in the newspaper, community radio (CBC, CKLB, CJCD, Taiga), Board website, including public registry and social media (Facebook); and,
- The Board will hold any other consultation or engagement activity that the Board considers appropriate.

Materials Circulated for Comment by Parties

During the course of this Proceeding, the Board, with Staff assistance, will review all evidence filed by the Parties and the public. These efforts are intended to identify issues or concerns which must be addressed in the Proposal and to resolve them, if possible, before the close of the Proceeding. This process allows Parties and the public to address the proposed management actions for Sahtì Ekwò in their written submissions to the Board and to prepare arguments setting out their positions with respect to these provisions at the close of the Proceeding.

The Board will make its decision at the close of the Proceeding on the basis of all evidence and arguments filed by all Parties.
