**Proposal on Bathurst Caribou Herd Management**  
**submitted jointly by Tł'chǫ Government and GNWT Environment and Natural Resources**

On November 5<sup>th</sup>, 2009, the Tł'chǫ Government and Department of Environment and Natural Resources (ENR) jointly submitted a proposal to the Wek'èezhìi Renewable Resources Board (WRRB) outlining proposed management actions for the recovery of the Bathurst caribou herd. The proposal has been posted on ENR's website <http://www.enr.gov.nt.ca/>.

On November 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>, the WRRB met to review the joint proposal. The WRRB considers any restriction of harvest or component of harvest as the establishment of a Total Allowable Harvest and in such cases is required to hold a public hearing. The Board has set a tentative date for a public hearing of January 11-13<sup>th</sup>, 2010 at the Behchokǫ Cultural Centre. The purpose of the hearing is to obtain additional information from Tł'chǫ Government and ENR regarding the proposal and allow interveners and the public an opportunity to express their views.

Under s. 12.5.4 of the Tł'chǫ Agreement, WRRB is required to consult with other management authorities that have jurisdiction over migratory wildlife before making its decisions or recommendations. In addition to management actions proposed for the Bathurst caribou herd, the proposal also presents actions to be applied to the Bluenose East and Ahiak herds. If you have any information that should come before the Board during the proceeding we ask that you please provide it for our consideration. We also ask that you notify the WRRB if there is any additional information you require to meet your management responsibilities.

**Process and Schedule**

All parties interested in participating in the proceeding are requested to notify the Board in writing by November 18<sup>th</sup>, 2009 providing contact information, a brief description of your issue or concern, and indication as to whether you intend to participate in the public hearing.
