Wildlife Research Permit Application – Mackenzie Bison Collaring Program 2021

Dear Mr. Armstrong:

As per section 12.5.1 of the Tłı̨chǫ Agreement, the Wek'èezhì Renewable Resources Board (WRRB) considers the above-mentioned Wildlife Research Permit application as a management proposal. The Board understands that the objectives of the Collaring Program are to fulfil a key action of the *Mackenzie Bison Management Plan* by addressing knowledge gaps, identifying critical habitat for wood bison, locating bison for anthrax and population surveys, and understanding habitat use.

The proposed collaring deployment, scheduled for February 15, 2023 to March 31, 2024, occurring within the Mackenzie Bison Range, involves the following:

- 6-year collars, which must be removed by recapture;
- 20 adult female collars maximum;
- Ground (by road) or helicopter captures may occur; and,
- Capture will occur by netgunning.

The WRRB has no concerns with the project as presented in your application, assuming ENR's acquires a NWT Wildlife Care Committee Permit (WCC). If ENR fails to acquire a WCC permit, then the Board would not approve the Wildlife Research Permit.

The WRRB is in support of the permit as written (Motion #841-13-12-2022). The WRRB requests results be provided to the Board upon completion of work.
