**Re: GNWT Management Proposal: Mobile Core Bathurst Caribou Conservation Area**

Minister Miltenberger:

Per Sections 12.5.1 and 12.5.4 of the Tł'chǫ Agreement, the Wek'èezhìi Renewable Resources Board (WRRB) has reviewed the Mobile Core Bathurst Caribou Conservation Area management proposal, as submitted and presented by the Government of the Northwest Territories (GNWT) on January 20, 2015 and January 22, 2015, respectively. The Board understands the proposed management actions to be as follows:

- Establish a Mobile Core Bathurst Caribou Conservation Area (MCBCCA), based on collared Bathurst Caribou locations and additional information from surveys, to protect the remaining core of the Bathurst Caribou herd for the 2014-2015 harvest season;
- Monitor the MCBCCA by using the most recent collar locations and periodic aerial reconnaissance surveys to update the boundary and location accordingly;
- Provide the weekly updated MCBCCA boundary and location to Aboriginal governments and wildlife management boards;
- Harvest of caribou will not be permitted within the MCBCCA;
- Harvest of a limited number of Bathurst Caribou bulls, up to a maximum of 15, may be considered within the MCBCCA for ceremonial purposes with the submission of a written proposal by an Aboriginal government with traditional harvesting rights for the Bathurst Caribou herd; and
- Require authorization cards, outside of the MCBCCA, for harvest within zones R/BC/01, R/BC/02, and R/BC/03. Harvest limits within the zones are still under discussion.

It is also understood that there is overall support for the MCBCCA approach by the Aboriginal governments, including the Tł'chǫ Government.

The WRRB has a mandate for wildlife, plant and forest management in Wek'èezhìi and adheres to the principles and practices of conservation in fulfilling its duties. As such, given the information provided in the GWNT management proposal and presentation, the WRRB supports the establishment of the proposed Mobile Core Bathurst Caribou Conservation Area through wildlife regulations and the amendments to the Big Game Hunting Regulations to require authorization cards for harvest within R/BC/01, R/BC/02, and R/BC/03 (Motion #307-22-01-2015).

The Board would like to stress the importance of educating Tłı̨chǫ communities and all NWT citizens on the new MCBCCA and its associated regulations. In addition to community workshops, the WRRB recommends using radio/television and social media to distribute a clear, concise, and consistent message about the mobile zone, including the weekly updates, and the need for authorization cards.
